IsaacLitton.Com Website Update

Friends, we have some unwelcome news and some exciting news!

The unwelcome news is that the web consultant we hired last year to update our current website has ceased to do business as of earlier this year. While we have made strides in updating most of the Website other than the Class Info section, we are now in a position of needing to start over.



After analyzing the current site including the content and the platform on which it resides, and after seeking professional consultation, we have determined that the current website is too unwieldy to update and maintain. It was wonderful while it lasted, and we continue to be so appreciative of the detailed work that Jerry Newman did on behalf of the ILAA website, but in the words of one of the web designers we consulted, there is no way they could charge a reasonable fee and make any kind of profit because of the sheer volume of information contained on the ILAA website. (For example, there are more than 12,000 images in the Galleries and Classes sections alone.)

Now for the exciting news! At the Board Meeting on March 26, 2025, we approved an agreement with Virtual Goldmine, a web designer who has been highly recommended by one of our board members who collaborates with them on another organization's website. Our ambitious goal is to be up and running by mid-year.

Our objective with this new website is to include all the features we believe to be the most essential, but presented in a more streamlined and efficient way. And we may be able to include features that we were not able to offer in the past. We are beginning the design phase immediately.

In the meantime, the current website will continue to be available (isaaclitton.com), updated as of approximately December 31, 2024 for all

sections except the Classes Section which was updated as of January 26, 2024. This website will continue to be available for the next twenty-four months. This is important because it means that you will continue to have access to gallery pictures, audio and video files, obituaries of deceased classmates, and other historical information, even if we do not transfer some of this information onto the new website.

We appreciate your patience over the past 15 months. Jerry spoiled us, and we still miss him dearly. It has been quite the learning curve, but we believe that we have turned a corner and are now heading in the right direction.

Applicant must be a direct descendant, or their legal guardian must have graduated from Isaac Litton High School, except for those who attended and would have graduated in 1972. Current Isaac Litton Alumni Association (ILAA) Board Members direct descendants will not be eligible.

Include FAFSA information and include additional data or unusual circumstances to show financial need:

Include an approximately 500-word Essay to describe yourself, your life and career goals, choice of college, extracurricular activities, Honors and Awards, community and other activities, work activities and Dates of Service.

Include a letter of recommendation covering character, personality and scholarship of the applicant from at least one person in authority in the school.

In addition to submitting the required Information, we **require** the following:

1) Upon being selected as a candidate you must be able to **attend a personal interview** before the scholarship committee or be available for a phone or ZOOM interview.

2) All scholarships are conditional upon the enrollment of the applicant in an undergraduate course in an accredited American College or University. Upon receipt of notice by the recipient, an ILAA Scholarship check will be forwarded to the College or University to establish a credit for the student. Students who become eligible for full scholarship funds will be withdrawn from consideration for the ILAA Alumni Scholarship.

SLAM SCAM!

Recently, scammers have been spotted taking advantage of our unique relationship in the Litton Alumni Association! Emails have arrived pretending to be our classmates and asking for help. PAY ATTENTION!

Even if you think you recognize the email sender, click on their address at the top and check to see that the email is actually sent from your fellow Lion. NEVER CLICK ON LINKS or respond if the sender is bogus!

Even if you think the sender is legitimate, ask a trusted friend for help if the email requests that you buy gift cards or money orders. That sort of request is almost always a scam.

Recognize scammers. They may:

- **PRETEND** to be from an agency or organization you know.
- Say there's a **PROBLEM** or promise a prize.
- **PRESSURE** you to act immediately.
- Tell you to **PAY** in a specific way.

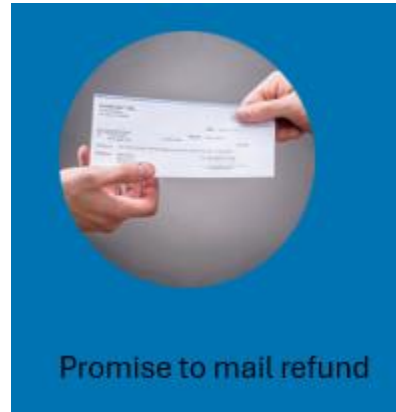
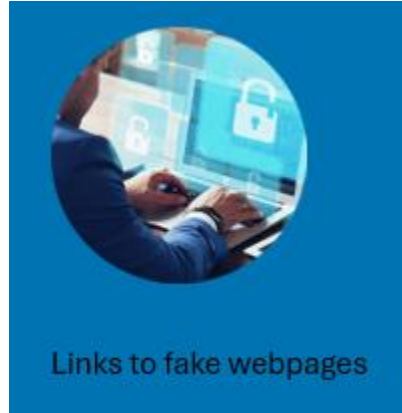


Do not give scammers money or personal information – Ignore them!

How to avoid a scam:

- **Remain calm.** Talk to someone you trust.
- **Hang up or ignore** the message. **DO NOT** click on links or attachments.
- **Protect your money.** Criminals will insist that you pay in a hard-to-trace manner, such as with a gift card, prepaid debit card, cryptocurrency, wire transfer, money transfer, or by mailing cash.
- **Protect your personal information.** Be skeptical of a contact you didn't initiate.
- **Spread the word.** Share your knowledge of Social Security-related scams. Post on social media using the hashtag #SlamtheScam to share your experience and warn others. Visit ssa.gov/soam for more information. Please also share with your friends and family.

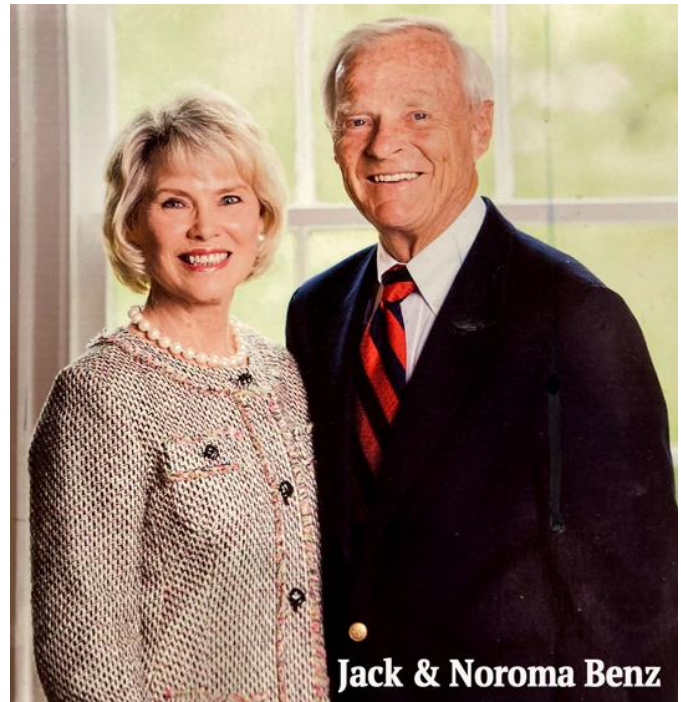

A dedication ceremony was held during Belmont's Homecoming Weekend on February 22, in the Beamon Student Life Center to Honor three Alumni for their dedication to Belmont University. One of those honored was Jack Benz, a Class of '51 graduate from Isaac Litton and one of our life long



lion's. Belmont will rename the 10-story Tall Hall Dorm as Jack Benz Hall, recognizing the 1955 Belmont Graduate. Located at the campus' southeast quadrant, the 610-bed facility sits atop a hill between 12th and 15th Avenues South, allowing it to be spotted from numerous points across Nashville.

After completing his business administration degree and service in the United States Army, Jack built a successful 50-year career in the insurance industry while maintaining strong ties to Belmont University. A student basketball player at Belmont, Jack continues

to support athletics and can often be found courtside at both home and away games alongside his wife, Noroma.

A longtime trustee, his ongoing commitment to the University includes service now as a Trustee Emeritus, where he has helped guide Belmont's growth and development. A lifelong Tennessean and Nashville native, Jack exemplifies the lasting connection between Belmont and its alumni through his continued presence and support of University initiatives.

As we all know, any time you turn around here in Nashville you see the presence of our alumni and all they have done to represent Nashville and our Isaac Litton Alumni Association. While our school closed 54 years ago, Isaac Litton Alums are still making a difference. We congratulate Jack on his achievements for Belmont University.

What's his story? Do you know him? All of us who do know him understand what a special and SPECTACULAR man he is.

Jay Dawson is a well-known arranger and composer. Mr. Swor (yes, our Mr. Swor) leaned heavily on him for our arrangements. He could do them on the fly! He graduated from Isaac Litton High School in 1965 and left a wonderful legacy behind him. But he didn't stop there.

Jay attended George Peabody College, graduating in 1969. He taught for six years in public junior high and high schools, and one year at the college level. For three years, he taught summer school graduate courses at Vander-Cook College in Chicago.

Jay can play any instrument he can get his hands on. He mostly played trumpet at Litton, but he was a French hornist for ten years in the Nashville Symphony Orchestra before becoming assistant conductor in 1977, for three years. He has written and consulted for Opryland USA, the Knoxville 1982 world's Fair, Memphis Blues, Valley Fever, and Bluecoats Drum and Bugle Corps. He is currently the arranger for the McGavock High School Band.

He has published works by multiple companies, including marching band music, concert band music, and drill designs for middle school, high school and college bands.

He and his lovely wife, Cynthia, have been married since 2003.

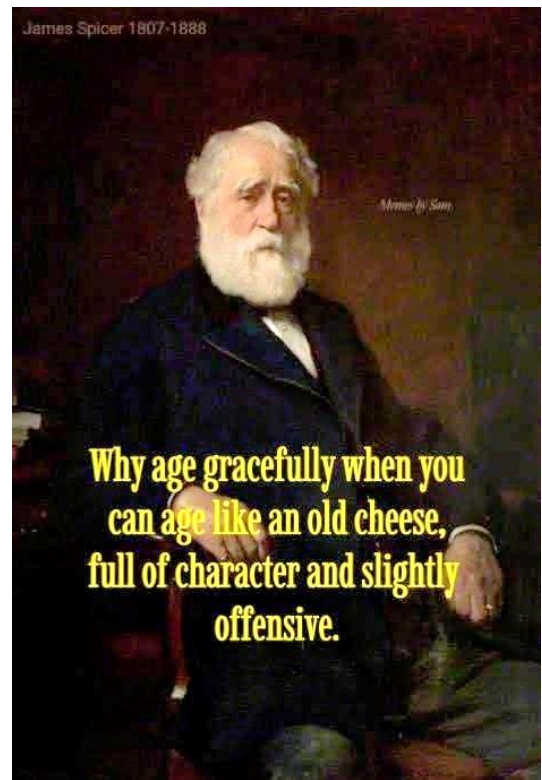
