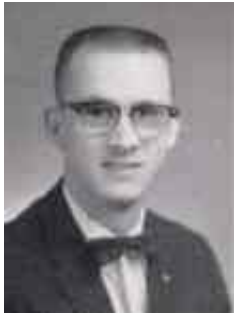

James Dean Brandon age 62assistant superintendent of Murfreesboro city schools and former Nashville educator died yesterday at his home after a heart attack. Services will be at 3 p. m. January 20 1967 at Woodfin Memorial Chapel. Dr H Eugene Cotey pastor of First Baptist Church will officiate. Burial will be in Evergreen Cemetery. Brandon a native of Wartrace TN attended the old Brandon Training School at Shelbyville founded by his late father AJ Brandon and was graduated in 1923 from Murfreesboro Central High School. He received a bachelor of arts degree in 1928 from the University of the South at Sewanee where he was a member of the I Order of Gownsmen and Sigma I Epsilon Honorary Society. 1 At Sewanee he played center and guard on the varsity foot-ball team. In 1926 the Sewanee team held the University of Alabama'ssecondRoseBowl1teamtoa2to0win for the Crimson Tide. Brandon's team that

year was captained by a longtime friend former Mayor Andrew L. Todd Jr. of Murfreesboro. 1 During his 11 years with the Davidson County school system Brandon was coach and principal of Jere Baxter School for two years principal of Isaac Litton High School for three years and principal of Nashville Central High School for six years. He received a master of arts degree from Peabody College in 1933. While in Davidson County he was president of the Davidson County Teachers Association a member of the Nashville Civitan Club and a colonel on the staff of Gov. Prentice Cooper. Upon his resignation from the school system he became assistant personnel director in charge of training for the state Department of Employment Security. Brandon moved to Savannah Ga. in 1943 when he became assistant personnel director of Southeastern Shipbuilding Corp. In 1946 he returned to Murfreesboro and served for one year as principal of McFadden Grammar School. The next year he became personnel director for the American Textile Co Murfreesboro plant. Brandon reentered public education in 1947 when he was named director of attendance and public relations for the Rutherford County school system. He was appointed to his present position with the city school system in 1956. He is a former president of the Attendance Teachers Association of Tennessee a past president of the Murfreesboro Rotary Club and a past president of the Murfreesboro-Rutherford County Chamber of Commerce. Brandon was a member of the Rutherford County Sportsman's Club and a past president of the Blue Raider Club an athletics booster club for Middle Tennessee State University. He was a deacon at First Baptist Church. He married the former Frances Watts of Nashville in 1942. She survives. Survivors also include a daughter Miss Alma Brandon Murfreesboro; a brother Lyon Brandon Jackson MS. and a sister Mrs. W. C. Cockrill Nashville. Murfreesboro schools will be closed at 2 p. m. today for the funeral.

Veteran Nashville musician James J (Bucky) Doster has died at age 91. Doster was a left-handed trombonist who toured with Glen Campbell and recorded with stars ranging from Johnny Cash to Brenda Lee. He grew up in Murfreesboro and played in dance bands during his high-school years as well as a college student at MTSU. He joined the AFM's Nashville local at age 19 in 1942. Following the onset of World War II he was inducted into the Army in 1943. While in the service he became first trombone with the 97th Infantry Division Band. The odyssey of Jack Van Hooser

Jack Van Hooser is a kindly, older gentleman with a gleam in his eye and a firm handshake. Although he lives in Nashville now, he graduated from Central High School in 1951. He played football, baseball and basketball, and he was Mr. Everything at the school. He won all sorts of awards before going off to Tennessee Tech where he won more. In spite of this, he tends to give the praise to others, and shies from taking any credit for himself. Jack is a gentleman's gentleman, and it is hard not to be charmed by him. Jack Van Hooser went on to serve as a school coach, and later as a distinguished member of state government. He finally was the director of Vocational Rehabilitation for the entire state before his retirement several years ago. His success in life is at odds with the struggles he had in growing up. This is the part of Jack's story that amazes me. Jack's father was a good bit older than his mother, and they were having marital difficulties. His mom and dad sheltered the three boys from any of this, and in 1939 they were divorced. The boys were told calmly and without rancor. It was decided that the youngest boy would go home to the mother's parent's farm with her, but that Jack and his older brother, Charles, would go with their father. zJack's Dad was a traveling salesman, of sorts. They packed all their worldly possessions into a single cardboard box tied up with twine, and they boarded a bus for the next big town down the line. Dad left the two small boys at the bus station as he walked around town until he found a boarding house, and a room for them to rent. Then he found a convenient taproom to knock back a few cold ones, before heading back to the bus station to collect his sons and their box. Dad's business saw him knocking on doors the next day looking for folks who had old photos that they wanted refinished and framed. After collecting several photos, and the requisite fees for his services, he would find a photo lab in town, and have the image cleaned up, enlarged and reproduced. He then went by some five and dime store, bought a cheap frame, and took the improved image of someone's loved one back to their house to pick up the final payment. It should be obvious that he was not getting rich. While Dad was out selling his services, the boys were usually left on their own for the day. Charles was a fourth grader and Jack was a first grader. They would wander the streets in whatever city they were in, but they studiously avoided getting in trouble. If they were in a big city, and were likely to be there awhile, their Dad would enroll them in a local school. Jack long ago lost any remembrance of all the many different schools they attended. Mostly they just wandered the streets, and got an excellent lesson in self-reliance. After several years of this zany existence, the boys came back to Maury County for high school. There at CHS Jack soared. His street smarts found him with good part-time jobs, but his social life was very limited. His mom had married Luke Moser at Bryant Station, and the boys helped him on the farm. In addition to this was school, a regular job in town, and Jack's first love – sports. He did not have time for that. He excelled

at sports, and was offered a full ride scholarship at Tennessee Tech. How could he refuse? He got his degree, but even better, he won the heart of one of Tech's Golden Girls. Jack and Wanda have been married for...well, quite some time. Their life together has been exciting, and they have a passel of beautiful grandchildren to prove it. Jack knew that his particular story was unique, so he has written a book about it. I read it cover to cover, and had a hard time putting it down. It is called, "A Journey to Remember."

Ronald Jefferson Webb – husband, father, educator and beloved granddaddy – died on Tuesday (Oct. 28 2014). He was 87. Mr. Webb was born in Nashville in 1927 and lived most of his life in Madison. He is survived by his wife of 57 years Loretta Webb; three children – Donnie Webb of Syracuse NY, Kathy (Gary) Loftis of Hermitage and Jeff (Rachel) Webb of Franklin; and nine grandchildren: Mike (Amy) Loftis, Jamie, Kerri and Krissy Loftis; Cody Austin and Alexis Webb; Amanda and Ashleigh Webb. He was preceded in death by another grandson Mark Loftis. For 50 years he devoted his professional life to public education in Nashville. Mr. Webb began his teaching and coaching career in 1951 at Isaac Littton then became the first football coach at Straford where he transitioned into administration as assistant principal. He later served as principal at Wright Middle School before transferring for his longest assignment – nearly three decades – as principal of McMurray Middle. He earned his B.S. from Middle Tennessee State University and his M.A. in Mathematics and Educational Administration from George Peabody College. John dedicated his career to education in Nashville. He began his career teaching and coaching at Hillsboro High School and Litton High School before moving into administrative roles as the assistant principal at Highlight Heights Middle School and later the principal at Bellevue High School. After his move into the central office with Metro Nashville Public Schools, John served as the Supervisor of Mathematics, then the Director of Employee Relations, next the Assistant Superintendent for Business Services, and finally the Assistant Superintendent for Administrative Services. He retired from MNPS in 1992, after handing his daughter and her classmates at Hume-Fogg Academic Magnet their high school diplomas. After his retirement from MNPS, he returned to work as first the Director of Business and Finance at Franklin Road Academy, and was later named the Headmaster at FRA. He retired from that position in 2001. Though he was not someone who sought recognition for his work, his peers chose to highlight his contributions to education numerous times. Governor Ned Ray McWherter awarded him with the Tennessee's Outstanding Achievement Award in 1992. He also received the Distinguished Service Award and Life Membership Award from the Tennessee Association of School Business Officials. He was active with the Tennessee Teachers Credit Union as well as Christ Church Cathedral, the PENCIL Foundation, and was the past president of the Tennessee Association of School Business Officials. On March 27, 2001, U.S. Rep. Bob Clement, a former student of his at Hillsboro High School, spoke on the House floor to honor Mr. Younger. He concluded his words by describing his life as "one of joy, humility, faith, friendship, and truth." Apart from these achievements and accolades, and the numerous roles he held, perhaps the name he valued most was "Granddaddy." He was his happiest on the golf course with friends, looking at the ocean with a drink in hand, traveling with Jessica, or most anywhere with his family. He knew how to fix most anything, always had a good story to tell, and knew that the time to put down grass seed was around the Tennessee – Florida football game. He was steadfast and calm.
